Representative Clarke,

The New England Human Rights , a Human Rights Organization based in Boston, Massachusetts, and the U.S. Human Rights Network : Working Group Chairman, are writing to solicit your intervention for the prompt release from jail of sister Dona Belizaire in Haiti.

The case against Sister Belizaire is void of an evidence of wrongdoing. Sister Dona Belizaire, the Haitian Mother Theresa, is the founder and director of the Sisters Redemptive Of Nazareth, an orphanage that has served the poor and the orphans for the last 26 years. Sister Dona has been behind bars, in a women's jail located in Petion-Ville, Haiti for over 27 months. During that time, she has not had the constitutionally guaranteed opportunity to appear before a judge.

Representative Clarke, we would appreciate your intervention on her behalf to ensure the prompt release of Sister Dona Belizaire. Sister Belizaire is eager to go back to her mission as she has written: " In spite of all my suffering and humiliation in subhuman conditions, when I am released, I will continue to

serve the orphans, widows and the poor of my country, just for the love of God and also for the happiness of my country.”
